

CityU Macau boasts a robust global network with 230+ international universities, particularly those in Portuguese-speaking countries. We offer 350+ English-taught courses to cater to the learning needs of exchange students from partner universities worldwide. Outstanding students may have the opportunities to have their accommodation fees waived and receive stipends by participating in practical internships in administrative offices.

The University encourages global exchanges and has played an active role in the ERASMUS + program (European Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students), the University Mobility Asia Pacific (UMAP), and the Association of Universities of Portuguese Language (AULP). These partnerships help gear up exchange and collaboration, enhancing the University's research capacity in producing translational output that benefits society, and providing exchange and internship programs for students and faculty which broaden their horizons with exceptional learning experiences.

With the strong support of the Central Government, the Macao SAR Government, and all sectors of society, the City University of Macau (CityU Macau) has inherited the legacy of the University of East Asia and developed an education hub that aligns with the socio-economic development and fulfills its responsibility and the mission of "Serving Macao, Integrating into the Greater Bay Area." As a metropolitan university with "Macao Characteristics, China Soul, and Global Vision," we prioritize Digital Humanities and Social Sciences supported by Data Science and continue to innovate disciplinary structure to educate high-caliber talents with solid knowledge foundations and hands-on capabilities.

Commitment to quality education and research excellence continues to drive us ahead. The University offers interdisciplinary programs with a "5-in-1" pedagogical model that combines International Learning, Experiential Learning, Intercultural Learning, Peer Learning, and Value-Added Learning. We are delighted to witness the University gaining recognitions in international academia over the past decade. Remarkable growth has been seen in faculty expansion aligned with the five pillars outlined for institutional development: Big Data, Fintech, Health and Wellness, Applied Linguistics and Intercultural Communication, and City Development. This year, the Faculty of Finance (FOF) has achieved the Gold status from the Business Graduates Association (BGA). With the new master's program in Financial Technology, FOF will further advance the University's interdisciplinary agenda, supported by one of its distinctive disciplines – Data Science.

In response to the SAR's development strategy, CityU Macau established the Faculty of Health and Wellness (FHW) in 2024 to promote digital healthcare and serve the growing demand for well-being among its citizens. FHW has partnered with leading enterprises and universities in the health-related field. Together with the Research Center for Authenmole Modern Chinese Medicine Big Health, established in 2023, FHW will enable the University to promote translational research, modernize traditional Chinese medicine, and foster the growth of the Big Health industry, propelling the city's "I+4" appropriate diversification development.

CityU Macau places great emphasis not only on high-quality teaching and learning but also on first-class academic research. With its ten faculties and 17 distinctive research units, the University has undertaken research projects in frontier fields for international organizations, ministries, and the Macao SAR Government. In 2021, CityU Macau, Soochow University, and the University of Évora established the Sino-Portugal Belt and Road Joint Laboratory on Science of Cultural Heritage Conservation under the Chinese Ministry of Science and Technology. This collaboration aims to advance development in materials science for cultural heritage conservation, ultimately preserving local historic building clusters.


In 2023, CityU Macau partnered with Beijing Language and Culture University and East China Normal University to establish centers dedicated to Chinese language education, training for Chinese educators, and people-to-people exchanges with Portuguese-speaking communities. These initiatives aim to strengthen cultural and economic ties, enhance mutual understanding, promote China's narratives, and solidify Macao's role as a bridge between China and Portuguese-speaking countries.

Currently, the faculty is conducting a research study on the driving factors for hotel industry to implement green supply chain management in the Greater Bay Area, utilizing its research power to promote sustainable practices in Macao's thriving MICE industry.

The International Business Cohort (IBC) is an English-medium class within the Bachelor of Business Administration that aims to cultivate global-minded business professionals. Students will explore big data, the Belt and Road Initiative, cultures, leadership, innovation, and startups within the scope of business, gaining valuable experience through internships, research assistance, academic projects, study trips, and campus activities. They also have the opportunities to build local and global networks through alumni talks and engagement with industry elites.

With the aim to serve modern financial development in the Guangdong-Macao In-Depth Cooperation Zone in Hengqin and Macao, FOF regularly hosts cross-border finance seminars and invites senior bankers, life insurance agencies, and experts from the region to host special lectures, providing students with practical industry knowledge and insights from experienced professionals.

The Finance Elite Cohort is a four-year undergraduate English-medium class that develops students' knowledge and applicability in applied economics and finance. 

Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (FHSS) is home to the Department of Innovative Social Work, General Education Department, and the Institute of Analytical Psychology. FHSS offers programs in Applied Psychology, Cultural Industry Management, Cultural Industry Studies, Social Work, Social Sciences, and Language Education. It prioritizes education, research, and knowledge dissemination, providing students with a comprehensive education for diverse careers in these fields.

Language programs at CityU Macau go beyond just proficiency and competency. These programs also incorporate cultural understanding and appropriate language usage, benefitting students in their future interactions and careers in a multicultural and globalized world. For example, the Bachelor of English program has two strands: Translation and Education, while the Master of Arts in Applied Linguistics offers four strands: TESOL, TCSOL, Intercultural Communication, and Teaching Languages to Young Learners. These settings allow students to acquire not only linguistics competency, but able to turn their passion for language into career and use advanced linguistic skills in employment to solve practical problems in the real world in which languages play key roles.




Food on Campus


Growing in a Like-Minded Community
