VU BLOCK MODEL® INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

The new VU Block Model® International Scholarship supports all international students starting foundation, undergraduate or postgraduate (coursework) studies at VU Melbourne in 2024. We'll reward you for studying well and support you to achieve your best.

You'll be awarded a 10%, 20% or 30% first year scholarship based on assessment of your previous academic results. The scholarship is guaranteed if you meet the entry requirements for any eligible course, but 30% scholarships are limited, so apply as soon as you can.

Successfully complete your first year of study and the scholarship could be extended or increased for up to the entire duration of your course. Visit the website for full details, terms and conditions.

WORK OPPORTUNITIES

Melbourne offers a wealth of employment opportunities across various industries, from casual work in areas like retail, hospitality and customer service to graduate positions and career development in healthcare, technology, engineering, education and so much more. It's the perfect place to get international work experience, develop new skills and kick-start your career.

Before applying for jobs in Melbourne, make sure your resume is up-to-date and well presented. Check in with our VU Employ team to get the best advice, including interview practice, access to our online job search and information about work rights. Australia has a strong system of laws and regulations to protect the rights of all workers, including international students. The current minimum wage is A\$23.23 per hour, but check on the Government's fair work website for updates and further information.

WHILE YOU STUDY

Many international students choose to work while living and studying in Melbourne. An Australian Student visa (subclass 500) allows you to work part-time up to 48 hours per fortnight, and full-time during semester breaks. Working part-time is a great way to support yourself, develop skills and meet new people. The VU Block Model teaching method offers focused and flexible timetables to help you balance study with work.

As an international student, you are required to maintain course enrolment and ensure satisfactory attendance and progress. We strongly advise you to keep up to date about any changes to your visa conditions, including work rights, such as the number of hours you are permitted to work.

AFTER YOU GRADUATE

If you're interested in staying in Australia to work after you graduate, you'll need to get a relevant working visa before your student visa expires. There are two options available to you under the Temporary Graduate visa (subclass 485): the Post-Study Work stream and the Graduate Work stream.

The Post-Study Work stream is for international students who have recently graduated from an Australian institution in any discipline. The Graduate Work stream is for international students who have recently graduated with skills and qualifications that are relevant to specific high-demand occupations in Australia. Both visas let you live, study and work in Australia for a temporary period of time.

Before you start your studies, it's a great idea to prepare a budget based on your lifestyle and accommodation choices. To help you prepare for life in Melbourne, these pages offer an indication of some of the costs you may incur. This is an approximate guide only and does not take into account your budget and spending habits.

TUITION FEES

Your tuition fees will be outlined in your offer letter. You will need to pay a tuition fee deposit to accept your offer. After you commence your course, you will be invoiced for each unit (subject) before it starts. Tuition fees vary by course and may change.

STUDY COSTS

You might need to buy equipment, textbooks or clothing, such as a uniform, for some courses. These costs are separate from your tuition fees. Allow approximately A\$650 for books and stationery each year, plus any compulsory equipment or uniforms.





LIVING COSTS

As a condition of your student visa you must have enough money to pay the first year costs of your stay, including your travel and living expenses.

As of October 2023, the Australian Government expects all new international students to have A\$24,505 in savings, with further funds available for any accompanying relatives. See the student visa application details on the Department of Home Affairs website for further details.

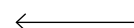
HEALTH INSURANCE

To study at Victoria University as an international student, you need to meet our academic and English language entry requirements. For a complete list of academic entry requirements and international equivalencies, follow the QR code above or visit: vu.edu.au/entry-international

Meeting the minimum academic requirements means you are eligible to apply for our courses but does not guarantee entry into the course. You may also be required to meet additional selection criteria such as minimum age, prerequisites, personal statement, or an interview or audition, which are considered alongside academic qualifications.

Please note that some courses may also receive more applications than the number of places available.

If you do not meet the academic or English entry requirements for your intended course, please check this guide and the online course page for details of any pathway options you may be eligible for.

You must provide evidence that you've completed an approved English language test, usually no more than two years prior to commencing your studies. 1 CHOOSE YOUR COURSE

2 COLLECT SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Gather the documents required to support your application. Providing the correct documents when you apply will ensure your application is processed promptly. You may wish to apply through a VU-approved education agent. To find one close to you, visit:

3 APPLY ONLINE

Apply to study at VU using our online system, EAAMS. You can apply directly or through an agent. Your entire application will be managed through this system.

4 ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

Log in to your VU account to check your application status. Once you receive a full offer, you need to sign your International Student Written Agreement and pay your tuition fee deposit in order to accept. Accept your offer as early as possible to ensure enough time to apply for your student visa.

5 ARRANGE A STUDENT VISA

Arrange your student visa through the Australian Department of Home Affairs. Visa processing times can vary, so apply as soon as you receive your Certificate of Enrolment (CoE) from VU.

6 ENROL

Once you have received your student visa, you can enrol in your course online before you arrive in Australia if you are studying a higher education diploma, bachelor or postgraduate (coursework) program. Otherwise, you can enrol in person when you come to campus for orientation.
